


## Change NetSet Email Settings on an Samsung Device using the Email App

You were issued a **new random email password** about a week before the migration. If you haven't done so already, you should **change it** first; otherwise proceed to step 6.


1. Log into Webmail at <https://mail.mynetset.ca/> on a computer (not a mobile device) with your full email address and new random password



2. Click on **Settings**



3. Under Settings, click on **Password**



4. Enter your **Current** random **Password**, and then your **New Password** twice

5. Click **Save**

### Changing Your Settings

6. Open the **Email** app using the icon




7. Tap the **three horizontal lines** to the left of **Inbox**




8. Tap the **gear icon** in the top right for **Settings**



1. Tap your **Account name** (typically your **email address**)




2. Scroll down to **Advanced Settings** at the bottom and tap **Server settings**




9. Change the following settings:

- a. Enter your new email **Password**
- b. If the **Incoming Server** is **IMAP server**
  - i. Change the **Server** to **imap.mynetset.ca**
  - ii. Verify the **Security type** is **SSL**
  - iii. Verify the **Port** is **993**
- c. If the **Incoming Server** is **POP3 server**
  - i. Change the **Server** to **pop.mynetset.ca**
  - ii. Verify the **Security type** is **SSL**
  - iii. Verify the **Port** is **995**





10. Scroll down to **Outgoing Server** and change the following settings:

- a. Change the **SMTP server** to **smtp.mynetset.ca**
- b. Verify the **Security type** is **SSL**
- c. Verify the **Port** is **465**
- d. Enter your new email **Password**




e. Tap **Done**

11. Tap the **arrow** at the top left next to your account name



12. Tap the **arrow** at the top left next to Email Settings



Your account is now ready for post-migration use in the Email app on a Samsung mobile device.
